- Relationship between plan member— Legal categories
 - Pension plan part of employer relationship
 - City of Los Angeles
 - State of California
 - Separate and apart from employer
 - 1937 County Employees Retirement Law—Why?

Legal Relationship

- Fiduciary
 - Examples/transparency
 - Constitution Article 16 Section 17 (b) states:
 - "The members of the retirement board of a public pension or retirement system shall discharge their duties with respect to the system solely in the interest of, and for the exclusive purposes of providing benefits to, participants and their beneficiaries, minimizing employer contributions thereto, and defraying reasonable expenses of administering the system. <u>A retirement board's duty</u> to its participants and their beneficiaries <u>shall take precedence over any other duty</u>."
 - Hittle v. Santa Barbara County Employees Retirement Association (1985) 39 Cal.3d 374.
