Her team has developed novel approaches, enabling the full absorption of municipal, university, non-profit, and other public authority plans into the Public Service Superannuation Plan; enhancing its membership numbers; and providing secure pensions to more Nova Scotians. More recently, she has spearheaded the PSSP's entry into Nova Scotia's private sector market, where it is anticipated that employers will join the plan on a go-forward basis. As an accompaniment to that work, new contribution and pension accrual levels were also implemented by her team. providing increased choice for employers and employees at varying levels of compensation. Kim currently volunteers on the International Foundation's Canadian Legal/Legislative and Public Sector Pension Committee, responsible for the planning of two major conferences. She is also a volunteer member of the Mount Saint Vincent University's Pension Governance Board in Halifax.
