

## Dr. Kyung-Shick Choi, Ph.D.

Professor of the Practice, Criminal Justice and Director, Cybercrime & Cybersecurity Boston University Metropolitan College Boston, Massachusetts

Dr. Kyung-Shick Choi, an internationally recognized cybercriminologist, serves as program director of the Center for Cybercrime Investigation and Cybersecurity (CIC) at Boston University. In this role, he spearheads graduate programs, fosters interdisciplinary research and training, and oversees cybercrime prevention strategies. He organizes conference sessions and workshops for researchers and practitioners, fostering cross-disciplinary collaboration. A seasoned expert, Dr. Choi offers law enforcement training and is a founder of the cybercrime division at the American Society of Criminology. Renowned globally, he has spoken at prestigious forums including the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime, INTERPOL and the AMERIPOL X Summit. As editor-in-chief of the International Journal of Cybercrime and Cybersecurity Intelligence, Dr. Choi conducts research on cybercrime victimology and has proposed the Cyber-Routine Activities Theory. He has authored multiple books, and his work is widely published. Currently, Dr. Choi leads federal cybercrime projects with organizations including the National Institute of Justice, the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinguency Prevention, and the Bureau of Justice Assistance.
