Michael Curry is the CEO of the Massachusetts League of Community Health Centers, which represents 52 health centers, serving over 1 million patients out of over 314 practice sites throughout the state. Curry also serves on both the City of Boston's COVID-19 Health Inequities Task Force and the Massachusetts Public Health Association's Task Force on Coronavirus & Equity. Prior to joining the League, Curry worked for 16 years at Blue Cross Blue Shield of Massachusetts, mostly as senior policy advisor in the Corporate Affairs Division. He has served on the health care transition teams for former Massachusetts Governor Deval Patrick and former Boston Mayor Marty Walsh and was involved in the passage of Massachusetts Health Reform and the Affordable Care Act. Curry has over 20 years of service to the NAACP, including as past president of the Boston Branch. He was elected to the National NAACP Board of Directors and reelected twice. He now serves as chair of the National Board's Advocacy & Policy Committee and as vice-chair of the Political Action and Legislation Committee. He also serves on the boards of the Massachusetts Budget and Policy Center, the Massachusetts Nonprofit Network and formerly on the board of trustees for Roxbury Community College, as well as adjunct professor for the Suffolk University Moakley Center for Public Management. He has received numerous local and national awards for leadership and advocacy. Curry earned a bachelor of arts degree from Macalester College in St. Paul, Minnesota and a J.D. degree from New England School of Law, and he graduated from the inaugural class of the Executive Leadership Council's Pipeline to Leadership Program.
