Prior to founding Liberty Co, Wanda enjoyed a 25-year career in the philanthropic sector serving with leading Canadian institutions. Now a neuro-inclusion thought leader and speaker, she partners with public, private and nonprofit organizations and is known for bringing creativity as well as passion to every session, panel and keynote. Her story of undiagnosed autism has been published in Broadview magazine as well as Reader's Digest in Canada and the U.S. Her article "Working Toward Neurodiversity Inclusion" is featured in the September/October 2023 issue of Plans and Trusts, and her insights on autism, neurodiversity and disability have been shared in The Globe and Mail. Wanda gives back to the community and industry in various ways, including as a Research Advisory Board Member for the Conference Board of Canada and as a Research Advisory Group Member for the University of Toronto. She was recognized as the 2023 Life Sciences Ontario Volunteer Award recipient.
