Dr. Bobbie Emetu is an associate professor of public health education. Her research focus is on sexual transmitted infections (STIs) and HIV/ AIDS risk behaviors. Emetu's research interests include condom use errors, innovative methods for STI testing, HIV-related stigma and the association between sexual abuse and sexual risk behaviors. She continues to conduct applied research within the areas of health education, disease prevention and sexual health. Emetu has taught multiple classes about sexual health and sexuality for nearly ten years, and she has worked extensively in counseling HIV patients as well as educating and providing STD and HIV/AIDS education. Additionally, she has been the first author on multiple peer-reviewed publications about sexual minority women. Emetu has been a frequent presenter at national conferences regarding sexual minority men and women. She has received grant funding to support her research in studying the health of sexual minority men and women. Emetu has been a member of the LA County Lesbian Bisexual and Queer Women Health Collaborative since 2017 and is the current co-chair of the LGBTQ+ at California University State Northridge. She received her Ph.D. from the Indiana University, School of Public Health.
