Shannon Fowler, J.D., LL.M. (she/her) is an assistant social science researcher at the University of Arizona Southwest Institute for Research on Women (SIROW). She is currently the project coordinator of the Lighthouse Project, a collaboration with the University of Arizona SIROW, Our Family Services and the Southern Arizona AIDS Foundation. The Lighthouse Project is a federally funded grant project aimed at providing affirming services to unstably housed LGBTQ+ young adults. Fowler is also a board member of the Tucson-Pima County Collaboration to end Homelessness, Tucson's Continuum of Care board. Tucson-Pima County was awarded the Youth Homeless Demonstration Project in 2019, and Fowler has served as a core planning member on systems reform to end youth homelessness including diverting pathways into homelessness with her specific focus being on LGBTQ+ youth. In 2019, she joined the Pima County Task Force for LGBTQ+ Court Involved Youth and is currently a co-facilitator of the Task Force. Fowler received her bachelor of science degree in sociology with a minor in political science from Oklahoma State University. Fowler also received her juris doctorate degree from Gonzaga University School of Law and an LL.M. degree in tax law from Georgetown University Law Center.
