Colin D. Furness is an infection control epidemiologist and assistant professor (teaching stream) in the Faculty of Information at the University of Toronto. Furness's work during the pandemic has been focused on informational problems in disease measurement and interpretation, appraisal of scientific evidence, public safety education and advocacy, and public health decision making. In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Furness created and directs a graduate course on the epistemology of misinformation in health. An outspoken critic of poor pandemic leadership, he has given over 2,000 media interviews in Canada and abroad since March 2020. He has also acted as an expert witness in several legal matters concerning workplace COVID-19 safety practices. Furness received his Ph.D. degree in the interdisciplinary field of knowledge management in 2010 and his master of public health degree in epidemiology from the Dalla Lana School of Public Health in 2014.
