



Anne R. Lindsay, Ph.D., FACSM

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Anne R. Lindsay is a professor at the University of Nevada, Reno. She conducts research and assesses, identifies and responds to public health issues, including inactivity, nutrition, chronic disease, obesity and eating pathology. Lindsay's applied research and programming focuses are physical literacy in young children and older adults; energy balance, physical activity and nutrition targeting obesity prevention across the lifespan; and gender-responsive, health-related research approaches to substance use disorder in women. Previously, she provided oversight to a multiemployer health promotion program with over 13,000 employees, including laborers, administrators, firefighters, security forces, culinary and medical staff; implemented worksite health promotion programs for corporations, small business, government, nonprofit agencies, hospitals and casinos; and managed YMCA programming that included fitness for older adults, sports, aquatics, youth camps and school fitness programs. Lindsay has published several peer-reviewed journal articles, fact sheets and creative audio-visual methods. A fellow of the American College of Sports Medicine, she serves on numerous local, state and national committees and editorial panels and has received several awards for her work.
