She was a driving force behind the 150 MW Mesgi'g Ugju's'n Wind Farm, a landmark project that proved what is possible when Indigenous leadership is at the heart of decision-making. Her contributions earned her the Excellence in Human Resource Management award, and she continues to champion economic sovereignty for Indigenous nations. A mentor at heart, she has supported over 120 emerging leaders through Indigenous Clean Energy (ICE), ensuring that the next generation is equipped to carry this work forward. She is also recognized as one of #WOMENLEADINGCLEANTECH, honouring her impact on sustainability and innovation.
