Dr. Zirui Song is an assistant professor of health care policy and medicine at Harvard Medical School and Massachusetts General Hospital as well as director of research at Harvard Medical School Center for Primary Care. His research has focused on health care spending and quality under global payment, Medicare provider payment policy and the economics of Medicare Advantage. Dr. Song has received the AcademyHealth Article-of-the-Year Award, the Daniel Ford Award for achievement in health services and outcomes research from Johns Hopkins, and a resident research award from the American College of Physicians. He was a member of the 2014 Forbes "30 Under 30" for science and health care. For teaching activities, Dr. Song has received the Certificate of Distinction in Teaching from Harvard College from 2009 to 2011 and twice received the Excellence in Tutorial Teaching award from Harvard Medical School. He was selected by peers for the Morton N. Swartz Humanism in Medicine Award from Massachusetts General Hospital and received the Joan P. Curhan Citizenship Award from Harvard University. Dr. Song graduated from Harvard Medical School magna cum laude and from the Ph.D. degree program in health policy (economics track) at Harvard University. He received his undergraduate degree in public health from Johns Hopkins University.
