He is the author of *The Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974: A Political History* and focuses his research on regulatory policies affecting retirement plans, health plans and other employee benefit plans. Before joining UB, Wooten was an associate at Bredhoff & Kaiser, a legal history fellow at Yale Law School and a Golieb Fellow in legal history at NYU Law School. He earned his J.D. degree and a Ph.D. degree in American studies at Yale and is a fellow of the American College of Employee Benefits Counsel.
