Kincaid Lowe Beasley is an evaluator in the Applied Research and Evaluation Branch, Division for Heart Disease and Stroke Prevention, at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). She leads comprehensive evaluation efforts for CDC-funded programs and leads evaluation research initiatives that aim to expand practice-based evidence for chronic disease prevention, treatment and management among communities with greatest need. In particular, Lowe Beasley has expertise in health-systems interventions and clinical quality improvement for hypertension control and treatment of acute stroke patients. She is currently working on evaluating the use of telehealth technologies to expand access to care and treat patients with high blood pressure, disseminating findings from scaling and spreading a hypertension management program, and leading comprehensive evaluation efforts of CDC-funded programs. Lowe Beasley received her M.P.H. from the Rollins School of Public Health at Emory University with a concentration in behavioral sciences.
